



Victrex plc, a world leader in high performance engineering thermoplastics, partnered with IT training consultancy Optimum to design and develop an end-user training programme for the UK rollout of its Microsoft Dynamics AX 2012 enterprise resources system. This was phase two of a global implementation to replace a range of legacy systems across the UK with Microsoft Dynamics AX 2012 ERP and Four Vision HR Plus.

During phase one in 2014, Optimum developed a role-based training template based on the first go-live for the USA that consisted of eLearning modules, reference guides, trainer packs and quick cards. Then, during phase two, a team of 40 super users within Victrex's UK operation developed and updated those training materials and then delivered training to users across the organisation.

Optimum's brief during phase two was to provide skill the trainer sessions to equip the super users with the skills and resources to cascade the training down and also to update the lesson plans and quick cards. Its consultants also supplemented Victrex's internal team by developing a series of interactive eLearning modules for finance, purchasing and HR.
